WHAT IS THE COMMUNITY CARE ASSOCIATION?

The Association is a Registered Charity (number 1178776) which is managed by a Board of Trustees who are all volunteers.

The committee meets regularly and welcomes new members.

There is a staff team of nine co-ordinating the day to day running of the Centre.

The Community Care Association offers a wide range of support services for those in need in the local community.

WHAT WE HAVE TO OFFER THE COMMUNITY

The Centre based in Town Close offers facilities for a variety of social and support groups.

There are two large Activity Rooms and a Meeting Room for hire. We have disabled facilities and can provide refreshments.

We consult with local carers and users of Health & Social Services to get to know what their views of such services are and to encourage involvement in the planning of these services.

GEOGRAPHICAL AREA WE COVER

Stokesley, Great Ayton, Great Broughton, Hutton Rudby and all the villages within a 15 mile radius of Stokesley.

SERVICES WE PROVIDE

Rural Community Transport—Provided by two fully accessible Mini Buses and a Volunteer Car Scheme. We provide a door to door service for elderly and disabled clients. Just ring the office with as much notice as possible to book your transport. This could be for hospital / doctor / dentist appointments or for shopping. We also run monthly excursions and shopping trips.

Respite Sitting Scheme - A volunteer sitter gives regular carers a much needed break of up to 3 hours per week in the client's own home.

Befriending Scheme - A service for the lonely & housebound. A volunteer will visit on a regular basis to sit and chat or do light shopping or pick up a prescription.

Good Neighbours Scheme - A service to help someone who needs “a job” doing that a “good neighbour” would be able to help with.

Day Centre - Our Day Centre is for people with dementia. We operate on Mondays & Wednesdays each week from 10am - 3pm. The Centre is run by qualified paid staff and supported by volunteers.

Carers Support Group - Held on the 2nd Friday in the month between 10am and midday at Town Close.

Listening Tapes - for the visually impaired. An audio tape is sent out once a month full of local news and information.

Lunch Club - Run every Thursday from 12 noon at the Town Hall. £4.50 for a lunch and dessert with tea or coffee to finish. Ring the office to book a place.

Friday Afternoon Refreshments - Served in Stokesley Town Hall from 12 noon to 2.00 pm.
Tea / Coffee / Orange Juice and Toasted Tea Cakes or Scones

Thursday Craft Club - Held twice a month on the 2nd and 4th Thursdays in the Community Care Activity Room from 10.00am to 12noon. £2.00 per session

Thursday Chairaerobics - at the Town Hall from 10.30 to 11.30am. Exercise to music while seated & make new friends as well.

Tea Dances - Held at The Village Hall, Great Ayton alternate Thursday afternoons. Please ring the office for dates.

Full of useful information about local groups & services.

Primetime - Held at Town Close, Stokesley, Friday weekly from 2pm to 3.30pm. Indoor bowls and curling, £2.00 per session to include refreshments.
